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LIST OF CHARACTERS

Gladys. Alice's mother. A traditional, boisterous dame with a big heart and an eye for the gentlemen!

Alice. Principal girl. Quite a feisty young lady who will always try and help her friends.

Prince Valentino. Principal boy. Agreed to an "arranged" marriage in order to rescue his father. Honourable young man.

Tweedle Dum. Half of comedy double act. Scares easily and bungles any task given.

Tweedle Dee. Slightly less "thick" half of double act. Looks after Tweedle Dum and tries to keep them on the right side of the Queen - but usually fails!

Queen of Hearts. Evil queen who plots to gain control of Wonderland. Has little patience with anyone, including her daughter. Plays one entire scene as Cilla Black

Princess Incontinenta. Snobbish, lisping, spoilt, ghastly princess - rather like Violet Elizabeth from "Just William"!

Billy. Prince's valet. Loyal friend who falls in love with Alice but does not try to compete with Prince. Happy, comical person who needs to interact well with most of the cast. (and the audience!)

Ernest Compost. Palace gardener - is really the King of Wonderland who has been put under a spell. Steadfast and trustworthy - he is the object of the Dame's desire. Needs to be able to convincingly play both a down-to-earth, slightly slow, commoner and a King with authority and presence.

White Rabbit. Traditional character who provides links between scenes. Slightly scatty, always in a rush.

Mad Hatter. One scene only - traditional character, ie: he's guite mad!

Dormouse. One scene only - restricted dialogue (he's generally asleep!)

March Hare. One scene only - traditional character.

Cheshire Cat. Supercilious, conceited know-it-all. If played in full animal costume, must be able to move gracefully in feline fashion.

Executioner. One scene - limited dialogue and action.

Mummy. Brief appearance for chase routine.

Voice of the Jewel. To provide voice for the Queen's magic sceptre. Speeches must be clear, and rhythmic.

Old Alice. Brief appearance for "senior" female.

Young Alice. Brief appearance for very young child - as small as possible but able to deliver two lines!

Spooks. Dialogue and action in one scene.

Compere. Voice over in one scene.

Adult Chorus. Several appearances as different characters. Choreographed routines to songs. Some dialogue.

Children's Chorus. Several appearances as different characters. Choreographed routines to songs. Some dialogue.

Alice In Wonderland

ACT ONE

SCENE ONE

White rabbit appears in auditorium, running through audience.

RABBIT Oh, dearie, dearie me; I'm late! I'm late! Hello, hello boys and girls. [arrives on stage] Oh goodness me, what a rush! Well here I am at last, all the way from Wonderland! Now then, that nice man at the [name of dramatic society] has asked me to come here to tell you a story. That will be nice won't it? It will be just like Jackanory! I say, I'm showing my age now - is that still on television these days? Well, anyway, would you like to hear the story about a girl called Alice? Good, then I'll begin. Once upon a time, when I was just a young fluffy bunny, Wonderland was a very different place than it is now; it was - well, now how can I describe it? I know, I think the best way would be for you all to come and see for yourselves! Would you like that? Yes? Come on then, come back in time with me, and see how the story began. Come and meet Alice and follow her on her amazing adventures in Wonderland!!!

Rabbit exits. Alice and her mother enter carrying bags/pushing a hand-cart.

DAME Oh Alice, Alice, I'll have to stop. I've got blisters on my blisters. [sits down on the ground and begins rubbing her feet].

ALICE Very well, but only a short rest. We must find somewhere to stay before it gets dark.

DAME Oh, what are we going to do? That it should come to this - nowhere to live, and all our worldly goods on one cart/in these bags. [begins to sob noisily]

ALICE There there mother, don't worry. Things will be alright, you'll see. It's not your fault that our miserly landlord threw us out. I still don't understand it, I mean we paid our rent didn't we?

DAME looks shifty.

ALICE We did. didn't we?

DAME Well, yes of course, but...

ALICE But what mother?!

DAME Well, I was a bit short last week so I raided your monopoly game and paid him out of that!

ALICE What? You gave him pretend money?

DAME Yes, well I thought he might pretend not to notice because he felt sorry for me.

ALICE And did he?

DAME No, he told me to go directly to jail and not to collect £200 for passing GO! **ALICE** Oh mother!!

DAME I know, I'm sorry, but you never liked it there anyway. It was much nicer when we stayed at the *[local hotel/B&B]*.

ALICE Oh well, I suppose we had better make the most of it. At least this is an adventure! We can make a new life for ourselves. We could go anywhere!

DAME Well I don't mind where we go as long as there's a chemist so I can get some plasters for these blisters.

ALICE Oh mother [laughing]. You do make me laugh.

White rabbit darts across the stage and off the other side.

DAME Ooh, what was that?

ALICE I don't know, it looked like a big rat to me!

Rabbit re-appears.

RABBIT A rat!! The cheek of it.

ALICE Oh, I'm sorry, I thought... wait a minute, you're talking!

RABBIT Oh, very well observed.

DAME Well I never did! A talking rabbit. I must have sunstroke. [fans herself]

ALICE How very peculiar. I've never spoken to a rabbit before. I'm Alice.

RABBIT And I'm late, goodbye. [starts to go, then stops and turns] Did you say "Alice"?

ALICE Yes.

RABBIT [to himself] Oh, the prophecy - could it be? No, surely not... but maybe...! Alice - yes! Hair like spun gold - yes! Carrying a heavy load - yes!! It must be true! **DAME** Is he speaking to us?

RABBIT Where are you travelling to?

ALICE Nowhere exactly. Where are you from?

RABBIT Ah, the most wonderful place you can imagine - only it's not so wonderful at the moment. Will you help me?

ALICE Us, help you? How?

RABBIT Where I come from we are at the mercy of cruel queen and the prophecy states that only a girl named Alice with hair like spun gold can save us, and she will enter Wonderland carrying a heavy load.

DAME Heavy load? Does he mean me? The cheeky little...!

RABBIT No madam, of course not. I meant your luggage.

DAME Oh, I see, that's alright then.

ALICE But what can I do to help?

RABBIT I don't know, but you must come with me - please! If you are looking for a better life then you must come to Wonderland.

ALICE Wonderland?

RABBIT Yes, please come with me.

DAME Is there a chemist there?

ALICE Oh mother! [to rabbit] Yes, we'll come, after all I did want an adventure.

RABBIT Come then, follow me into the magical kingdom of Wonderland!

SCENE 2

Opens with SONG/CHORUS ROUTINE. "Happiness", "Walking on Sunshine". With chorus as colourful and fantastic characters. Billy and Ernest participate. Towards the end the White Rabbit, Dame and Alice enter from upstage and wind their way through the dancers who greet them, shake hands, swing them round etc. All take final position for applause.

DAME Oh dear, we have only been here two minutes and I am exhausted already. Look at my poor feet now; I've got blisters on my blisters on my blisters!

BILLY Pardon me for saying, but you should really get them seen to. Have you ever considered getting them plastered?

DAME Oh, I don't mind if I do. [takes a hip flask from her pocket and has a swig] **ALICE** Oh Mother, don't show me up!

RABBIT Now, now before we all get carried away it's time for some introductions, so listen everybody. I want you all to meet Alice and her mother Gladys. They have come to stay for a while.

Everyone gathers round.

CHORUS MEMBER Alice? Is that your name?

ALICE Yes. How do you do.

CHORUS [speaking to each other] Alice? Alice! Look, she's got hair like spun gold. It's the prophecy!

DAME What are they doing? Don't they know it's rude to whisper?

RABBIT Exactly. Come on you rabble - get about your business. Don't be rude to our visitors. You'll see them again later. Off you go.

Chorus/dancers exit chattering excitedly.

RABBIT Now then Alice, Gladys, this is Billy. He works at the Palace.

BILLY Very pleased to meet you [bows].

ALICE Hello Billy.

DAME Top of the morning to you young man.

RABBIT And this is Ernest. He is the palace gardener.

ERNEST [to Alice] Welcome to Wonderland Alice. [to Dame] Madam, what a pleasure it is to meet you [kisses her hand].

DAME Ooh, I say, what a charmer! [to Rabbit] Gardener you say? Well he can hoe my onions any day of the week.

ERNEST I'd rather wheel you away in my wheelbarrow!

DAME Well it might come to that if my blisters don't get better soon.

ERNEST Oh you poor fragile thing; let me help you. [takes her arm] I think you and I should pay a visit to the [local chemist]. They will soon fix you up.

DAME Oh, alright then. I'll see you later Alice. Will you be alright on your own?

BILLY Of course she will - I'll make sure of that. **ALICE** Thank you. Bye mother - behave yourself. **ERNEST** Oh, I hope she doesn't!

Dame and Frnest exit.

RABBIT Now then Alice, come along with me. I want you to meet someone else.

ALICE But what about our luggage?

RABBIT Oh, Billy will you keep an eye on it for Alice please?

BILLY Yes, of course.

ALICE Thank you. Perhaps I'll see you later?

BILLY Yes - I hope so.

Rabbit and Alice exit.

BILLY Oh, she's beautiful. I've often dreamt of meeting a girl like her. If only she would notice me, but as soon as that rabbit introduces her to the Prince she'll be smitten. Oh, when will I ever find someone to love.

SONG

"Somebody to Love", "When I fall in Love". Upon applause (hopefully) he "notices" the audience.

BILLY Oh, hello. I hadn't seen you all there until now. Oh I feel a bit daft now singing away to myself like that! Why didn't you stop me? Most people usually do! But I'm afraid my feelings ran away with me after meeting Alice. She is lovely isn't she? Do you think she could ever like someone like me; after all I'm just the Prince's valet. Never mind, if she would only be my friend that would be something. Now what can I do to make her like and trust me? Oh, I know, she wants me to look after her luggage. I can do that easily... oh, no I've got to get back to work soon and I can't take it with me. What can I do? Can you think of a way of helping me? Would you? No I don't know you well enough to ask... but could you? No I'm being cheeky oh what the heck I'll ask. Would you help me please? If I leave the luggage here would you look after it for me please? You would? Oh that's great. Thank you very much. I tell you what we'll do. If you see anyone go near it or mess about with it, you just yell 'BAGGAGE' and I'll come arunning. OK? Shall we try that now? I'll pretend to try and steal that suitcase OK? [sneaks over to the luggage and starts to pick up a case]

AUDIENCE BAGGAGE!

Dame enters being pushed in a wheelbarrow by Ernest.

DAME Hey, who's calling me baggage? And what are you doing with my suitcase you light-fingered rascal.

BILLY No, you don't understand. Alice asked me to watch your luggage for you and I've enlisted the help of all my new friends out there.

Dame sees audience and Ernest tips her out of the barrow.

DAME Owch! Ooh, I think you've just damaged my credentials! Help me up will you? [grabs onto Ernest's belt and his trousers are pulled down as she tries to get up] Oooh I say!

ERNEST Do you mind?!!

DAME Sorry love. You want to get yourself a new belt Ernest. That's a right tatty thing you've got there - you've lost the buckle! Now then, hello out there! So you're Alice's new friends are you? Well she never did have good taste! Oh I'm only joking, you look a happy lot really - well apart from this lady/gentleman [indicates someone in the front row]. What's the matter with you? Have you lost a pound and found a penny? I lost a pound once, but I soon found it again after only one cream cake! Well I hope you all enjoy yourselves here, I think I'm going to have fun. That Ernest is a bit of alright isn't he? I think I'm in there don't you? But we seem so well suited - I mean he's a rugged, earthy, man of the soil and I'm a blooming, delicate rose!

BILLY You're a bloomin' something alright, but I wouldn't go as far as rose.

DAME Oh be quiet, what do you know about it anyway? In fact what do you actually do in this town Billy?

BILLY I work at the place for the Prince Valentino; I'm his valet. But I think my job description is changing because I've been asked to think of something fun and exciting to keep all the children in Wonderland amused when they are not at school.

DAME Oh, well why don't you run a crochet and knitting class?

ERNEST No, they would always be able to pull the wool over his eyes. Why not show them the delights of organic farming with horse manure.

BILLY No, we've "dung" that already!! What we are really hoping to do is start a youth club for them but we need to find someone who is hip and happening and who has got their finger on the nub of youth!

DAME Look no further - you've found her!

BILLY/ERNEST You!!!

DAME Why not? I love children, although I couldn't eat a whole one. Yes, I could look after them.

BILLY You haven't met them yet have you?

DAME No, why?

BILLY Oh nothing; they are just a lively bunch that's all. I think you'll like them.

ERNEST Don't be silly Billy.

BILLY She'll have to learn Ern.

BILLY/ERN It won't be that bad Glad.

DAME Oh I'm not worried! I had better get and sort myself out then. Byee! [Exits] **BILLY** Come on, we had better make sure she doesn't get into trouble.

Billy and Ernest exit as curtains close.

SCENE 3

White Rabbit enters from left and crosses stage with Alice following him.

RABBIT Hurry up, we're going to be late. Stop lagging behind dear.

ALICE I'm sorry but I'm tired. Can we stop for a minute?

RABBIT No, come on. [runs off to the right]

ALICE Oh dear. [starts to follow him but drops her handkerchief and stops to pick it up] Wait a minute Mr Rabbit. (rabbit has gone) Oh bother, where has he gone. Oh that silly rabbit! How am I supposed to know where to go now? [sees the audience] Oh hello, maybe you can help me. Did you see which way he went? This way? Oh thank you very much. I'm Alice by the way. Are you all visiting Wonderland too? Isn't it an exciting place? Right then, I had better go and look for this rabbit hadn't I? Thank you, I'll see you soon hopefully. [backs off towards the right exit and bumps into the Prince Valentino who is rushing on]

BOTH Ouch!

PRINCE Oh I do apologise.

ALICE No, it was my fault; I wasn't watching where I was going.

PRINCE Well I should not be rushing like that. I'm looking for someone you see.

ALICE Oh, so am I. Now, this may sound like an odd question but have you seen a white rabbit in a blue coat go by?

PRINCE Yes, he was in a hurry too.

ALICE Oh dear, I'm supposed to be with him. I am Alice and he was going to take me to meet the Prince Valentino.

PRINCE Was he now? Why was that?

ALICE I'm not really sure; I think he's introducing me to all his friends, but I'm not really looking forward to meeting the Prince as he's sure to be awfully ugly and a terrible bore.

PRINCE What makes you say that?

ALICE Well all the princes in my country are like that.

PRINCE Well you never know, you could be surprised.

ALICE Do you know him?

PRINCE Well, yes, very well actually. But let's not talk about him. What brings you to Wonderland?

ALICE Well I suppose you could say we were just taking a chance on a better life. We were homeless and poor so we just packed our things and started travelling. Then we met the White Rabbit and he invited us into Wonderland.

PRINCE Well I for one am very glad that he did. I have never met anyone quite like you before. I hope you are going to stay for a while - life suddenly looks much brighter now.

SONG

"Take a Chance on Me" / "Love Lift Us Up Where We Belong / "Perfect Moment"

PRINCE That was fun. I have almost forgotten what I came here for now.

ALICE Yes, and me. I am supposed to be looking for that silly white rabbit. Who were you looking for?

PRINCE My val... [starts to say valet then stops himself] err, my very good friend, but he's not here. [looks around and sees the luggage] Oh, what's this? [goes over]

Billy enters to audience shouts.

BILLY Thank you, you're doing very well. Hey, what do you think you are... Oh it's you sir.

ALICE Sir??!!

BILLY Oh, I'm sorry - Your Majesty!

ALICE What? Who do you mean?

BILLY Why, the Prince of course.

ALICE The Prince! [looks at the Prince in shock]

PRINCE Yes, I am sorry. I hope you didn't find me too ugly or such an awful bore.

ALICE No, not at all - but you should have told me. Fancy letting me say all those things about princes, and sing that song with you. I feel so embarrassed.

PRINCE Well I enjoyed singing with you.

ALICE So did I, but that was still a mean trick to play. It just makes me think that Princes can't be trusted!

BILLY Alice! [horrified] You can't speak to his majesty like that!

PRINCE Yes she can. It was quite refreshing to speak to someone who appeared to like me just for being me, and not for being a prince.

ALICE I do like you.

PRINCE [takes her by the hand] Oh you have no idea how much those words mean to me.

Billy rushes between them.

BILLY Stop right there! I can see where this is leading. You've got to tell her.

ALICE Tell me what?

BILLY You must sir, it's not fair on either of you.

PRINCE Yes, you're right. Alice, there's something I must tell you before my heart rules my head. Come and sit down. [takes her over to bench/swing] As you now know I am Prince Valentino and up until 3 years ago my father was King. He threw a big party for my 18th birthday and invited Kings and Queens from other countries to bring their daughters so I may have the chance of meeting someone I wished to make my bride. Unfortunately we had an uninvited quest - the Queen of Hearts - who presented her daughter to my father as a possible wife for me.

ALICE What was she like?

BILLY [laughs] Like a cross between a chipmunk and a bloodhound - with a weird personality to match!

PRINCE Billy, hush! Now the Queen wanted us to marry to unite our two families to give her more power but my father only wished me to marry for love and not for convenience, so he turned her down. The Queen was very angry and cast a spell on my father. He disappeared and no-one has seen him since.

ALICE But that's terrible! Isn't there anything you can do to get him back?

PRINCE Well yes. I had to agree to marry the Princess on my 21st birthday and forfeit my rights as future King. Then and only then will my father be returned to his home, but not as King, merely as one of the Queen's subjects.

ALICE I see. [pause] So you are in fact betrothed to another?

PRINCE Yes, but not for love. If only I had met you before. But you must understand that I have to try to save my father, even if it means a life time of misery for myself.

ALICE Yes, I see that, but there must be a way to help without you having to marry this princess. Is she really so awful?

BILLY Yes! Her name will give you a clue - she's the Princess Incontinenta! **ALICE** Oh dear.

PRINCE Yes, oh dear. But please Alice, will you remain my friend, even if that's all we can be?

ALICE Of course; and I'm not giving up this easily. I'll try and find a way to help you get your father back without having to agree to the Queen's nasty bargains. I haven't met her yet, but I'll give her a piece of my mind when I do!

BILLY What a girl!

PRINCE Come on, let's find this white rabbit. He's probably tearing his whiskers out with worry about you.

They all exit and curtains open.

SCENE 4

Queen's Castle - red and black scenery. The Queen is seated on a throne being waited on by chorus members (dressed as playing cards) as they perform a CHORUS ROUTINE (rap/chanting song, sycophantic lyrics). Two chorus members are cooling her with big fans; two are manicuring her nails; one is brushing her hair; two are at her feet. The song ends when one of the chorus members breaks one of the queen's nails.

QUEEN You stupid fool! Look what you have done.

CHORUS I'm sorry your majesty; please forgive me.

QUEEN Get out of my sight you imbecile. I see I cannot trust you to do this simple task properly - get and work in the kitchen! [pushes the chorus member with her foot and the whole chorus topples over like dominoes] Don't just lie they you lazy lot! Go and see if you can manage to get the princess ready. I want her to begin her beauty treatment in preparation for the wedding celebrations.

CHORUS Yes your majesty, your highness.

They exit bowing and scraping, the Queen stops the last one.

QUEEN You! Bring me my sceptre.

CHORUS At once your highness, your eminence, your majestical being.

QUEEN Get out! [roars]

As last chorus member exits, the queen turns and sees the audience.

QUEEN Oh! What have we here? Have you all missed your last bus home? Or have you come for the Bingo? Oh, I know - you must have all come to feast your eyes on the beautiful Princess Incontinenta.

Band sniggers.

Silence!! Who rattled your cage?

BAND Oh come on, I mean "Incontinenta". What kind of name is that?

QUEEN A regal and powerful name. Why, my late husband chose it himself. It was about the only good suggestion he ever had - dear old Sean.

BAND Sean who?

QUEEN Sean de Leer!

Band laugh again.

QUEEN Enough! I command you to be silent or else l'Il come down there and snap your drumsticks! And you lot can shut up too *[to audience]*. Don't you know I am the most powerful being in this land?

BAND Oh no you're not.

QUEEN Oh yes I am [sweetly].

ALL Oh no you're not.

QUEEN Oh yes I am. [slightly peeved]

ALL Oh no you're not.

QUEEN Oh yes I am, and don't you dare argue with me you pathetic commoners. [shouts]

Chorus member bring on the sceptre.

QUEEN Aha, now you will see how powerful I am. None of you will have ever seen anything like this before. Bring it here my child. [sweetly]

Chorus member moves very slowly towards her.

QUEEN [snaps] Today if possible, you miserable creature. [takes the sceptre and holds it aloft] Get out of here - this is not for your eyes.

Chorus member exits hurriedly.

Jewel of the night as you start to glow; Tell me all that I wish to know.

The jewel on the end of the sceptre begins to glow.

JEWEL I hear you oh mistress and I obey;

What is it that you wish to hear today.

QUEEN Merely that all is well and nothing has happened to upset my plans. Is the Prince still going to marry my daughter?

JEWEL Yes, this is true but all is not as it seems;

Your daughter is no longer the girl of his dreams.

QUEEN Just as I thought... wait what did you say? [shakes the sceptre] Do you need new batteries? Tell me again!

JEWEL A girl named Alice has stolen his heart;

But for his father's sake they have agreed to part.

QUEEN Oh, well that's alright then! Why did you waste my time telling me this? This Alice is probably some low-down scullery maid that has caught his eye; but he isn't going to let his father down now. Jewel, be silent.

The light fades from the sceptre and she places it in its stand.

QUEEN Now do you see how strong my power is? With my magic jewel I can find out anything about anybody. I could find out what you had for tea last night [to member of audience]; or I could even get next week's lottery numbers. But if I did, I wouldn't tell you. [laughs evilly] Now I think it is time you met my daughter. Please be careful how you behave in her presence; she's very highly strung you know. [calls off stage] Incontinenta... darling... come here sweetie!

INCONT [from off stage] Coming mother.

She enters by skipping on and cavorts around the stage singing. She is a plain looking girl with lots of freckles, pig-tails and protruding front teeth.

QUEEN Darling, come here for a moment. Incontinenta, please. Darling... WILL YOU COME HERE GIRL!

INCONT Don't shout at me mother because you know what I will do.

QUEEN Oh don't be so childish dear. Remember you will be a married woman soon.

INCONT Ooh, rather! Then I can lie around the house all day stuffing cream buns and ginger beer!

QUEEN Yes, that's right dear. But you must remember why you are marrying him. You will have responsibilities as part of the family which rules this land.

INCONT Oh whizzo! I think it will be an awful wheeze being married to the Prince err, what's his name again?

QUEEN Valentino!! Now listen, I want you to meet some people. [indicates the audience]

INCONT [looks distastefully at the audience] Well, I'm not really interested in meeting them. They look like common oiks to me. I'm more interested in what is in these cases. Are they presents for me? [goes over to the luggage and audience shouts]
